

POLICIES FOR GEOMETRY

KEY POINTS

- Class schedule, homework, and all lessons are on rosenmath.com.
- Grades are posted in Aeries.
- Late homework will not be accepted.
- Students can earn extra credit points for a math photo.
- Math Lab is available every morning in Room 7106.

CLASS MATERIALS: It is recommended that all students bring paper, a pencil and an eraser to class each day. It is also recommended that students have a scientific calculator -- one will be provided for use in class, but students may need it at home when completing assignments. Students are required to bring their ChromeBook to every class.

HOMEWORK: Students can expect to be assigned homework every day. All work must be shown on the homework (just a list of answers will not be accepted). Credit will be given for attempting problems and for showing corrections on the paper. Late assignments will not be accepted.

NOTEBOOK: Geometry is a subject that depends heavily on definitions and properties, and students need to be able to rely on their notes to do assignments and prepare for tests. For this reason, students are strongly encouraged to keep their notebooks complete and organized. When a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to get any missed notes from the class website (see below).

EXTRA CREDIT: Each semester, students can earn 10 pts for bringing in a picture of themselves doing math. Locations can be anywhere, as long as the picture is not taken at school or home and as long as the location is obvious. Students can bring the picture at any time during the semester to receive credit. Photos can be printed or e-mailed to Mr. Rosen, and only one picture will be given credit per student each semester.

MAKE-UP WORK: If a student knows that he or she is going to be absent, it is the responsibility of the student to arrange for make-up work. In the case of an unexpected absence, students are responsible for making up the assignments that were missed. Students should be prepared to complete all make-up quizzes and tests on the day that they return to class.

OUTSIDE HELP: Mr. Rosen is available to give assistance to students most days before school and at lunch (check with him to make sure he will be available). In addition, the Math Lab is a place for students to get extra help from a CHS math teacher. It is available every morning before school in Room 7106.

WEBSITES:

Class Website (rosenmath.com): Mr. Rosen's website lists all class activities including tests, quizzes, homework, worksheets, activities, and sections covered. In addition, because all lessons are done on PowerPoint, Mr. Rosen will make those files available for download from rosenmath.com (this is great if a student is absent or missed something in class).

Aeries (access through Clever): Students can view current grades in Aeries Gradebook.

GRADING: Each student's grade will be based on classwork/homework (10%), quizzes (30%), and tests (60%). Students are allowed to do corrections for any quiz to earn back half of the points that were missed – this work must be completed in the Math Lab.

GRADING SCALE:

98% - 100% = A+	93% - 97% = A	90% - 92% = A-

I will curve decimals, but 89.4% is still a B+.

MISC.:

- All work should be done in pencil. It is easy to make mistakes in math, and erasers don't work well on ink.
- Cell phones, music devices, and other electronic devices are distractions to the learning environment, so they should not be used in our class. This includes calls from family members.
- Students are expected to show respect to each other, to Mr. Rosen, and to classroom visitors.
